Kim had the opportunity to speak to Rotary at Caring Hands about how the library creates the long range plan and how the public can get involved. Kim also traveled to Columbia, MO for a MOBIUS board meeting. Kim volunteered to create a member survey to determine if they can cut back on membership meetings, which could possibly save her 2 Columbia trips a year. The director from Christian County in MO and Kim were selected to give a presentation at the conference about dealing with material/program/display challenges.

Adult Programming – Molly has jumped right in as the new adult programming assistant. She is currently still dividing her time between the front desk and programs. One of the local master gardeners presented information on sustainable gardening during two sessions. In May there is a life coach lined up to present talk about personality types, specifically how to understand your own and how to interact with others during two sessions.

Teen Services – April was another good month for teen programming. 51 attendees came to 7 programs. Mary planned a good variety of activities, and from board games to crochet to special events like Pokemon Card Painting, a Potato Chip Taste Test, and the Teen's Gambit - 7 kids came to play chess!

Children's Services – April went by in a blur. Programming was a little light, because of planning for the Tech Fest event. There were a couple of special events and guests this month. First was Happy Heart Yoga who came to do a kids yoga class. Next was the 5210 Healthy Choices Count who came to do a storytime with the kids about eating healthy and staying active. For the special events there was a Silly Sock Hop and the Mario Party. The Mario party was a big hit!

Sheila visited the Little Rams Family Night to talk to families about the upcoming program. It draws a big crowd with 230 parents and kids! Sheila also did a few more outreach storytimes since that will be going on break in May.
